

What is the Age-Friendly Minnesota Council?

- Created by Governor's executive order in December 2019 (EO 19-38)
- Public/private partnership of multiple state agencies and leaders developed recommendations for an age-friendly state -- one that engages older people and understands that to be age-friendly, a community must consider the social, economic, and environmental and lifestyle factors that influence health and aging for everyone.
- Specific recommendations issued in Fall 2020
- Coordinate multiple state agencies' efforts and resources for Age Friendly
- Reframe Aging

Age-Friendly MN Timeline






State Agencies in Age-Friendly Efforts

- 1 territory (VI)



- Coordinate state, local and private partners' collaborative work on emergency preparedness for older adults, communities, and persons in zip codes most impacted by COVID-19.




Age-Friendly Master Plan

Age-Friendly MN Master Plan

Age-Friendly Master Plan: New cross-sector effort to develop a plan that integrates aging in innovative, comprehensive ways

- Leverage public and private resources to develop a blueprint for an Age-Friendly MN
- Communicate strategically to gain broad support
- Leverage data to support messaging and establish metrics for success
- Engage state legislatures to create lasting change




DEIA in Capacity Building and Grants

Age-Friendly Minnesota Grant Program

Two grant categories:

- Technical Assistance Provider (TAP) Grants: TAP grantees will help communities complete grant applications and undertake other age-friendly efforts
- Community Grants will help communities undertake agefriendly work
- Communities defined broadly—units of governments, nonprofit organizations, collaborative community efforts, businesses, etc.
- Grants will support work to:
 - Advance age-friendly planning, systems, policies and environments
 - Coordinate state, local and private partners' collaborative work on emergency preparedness for older adults, communities, and persons in zip codes most impacted by COVID-19



Funding Areas

- 1. Health and social services
- 2. Transportation access
- 3. Safe and affordable housing
- 4. Social connection and inclusion
- 5. Ageism and racism
- 6. Outdoor spaces and buildings
- 7. Communications and access to technology
- 8. Opportunities to stay engaged and financially secure
- 9. Emergency preparedness
